History

The Supported Independent Living Service was created in 1996 as a pilot project funded through the Canadian Association for Community Living. At the time, several adults with intellectual disabilities in Yellowknife were moving from group home life to living in their own homes. The Service helped the adults to manage this transition safely .
